Bylaw Changes To Section 7 Dues

The following changes to Section 7 “Dues” had their first reading at the September General Membership Meeting. Their second reading will be at the October General Membership Meeting on October 5th. These changes to the Bylaws were submitted, and approved, to the Board of Officers and Directors at the July 2010 Meeting.

Senior Membership

A Senior Membership will be offered for annual dues at 75% of the current annual dues. Applicants must be age 68 or older. Existing members must request a Senior Membership and it will take effect on their next renewal date.

In-State Distance Membership

An In-State Distance Membership will be offered for annual dues at 62.5% of the current annual dues. Applicants must show proof of primary residence outside of the following counties: Anderson, Boyle, Bourbon, Clark, Estill, Fayette, Franklin, Garrard, Harrison, Jackson, Jessamine, Lincoln, Madison, Marion, Mercer, Nelson, Rockcastle, Scott, Shelby, Spencer, Washington, and Woodford. If an In-State Distance Membership Member relocates inside of the mentioned counties than their membership will convert to the appropriate membership at the next renewal.

Out of State Membership

An Out of State Membership will be offered for annual dues at 50% of the current annual dues. Applicants must show proof of out-of-state primary residence. If an Out of State membership member relocates to Kentucky than there membership will convert to the appropriate in-state membership at the next renewal.

Trap Tips By Charlie

In the first article I discussed safety and the second article I focused on how to use your eyes correctly. In this third article I will talk about how to hold the gun. One of the keys to shooting correctly is mounting your gun the same every time. This will give you the same “sight picture” looking down the gun.

First, hand placement. These instructions are for a right handed shooter and you can reverse this advice if you are a lefty. Grip the forend (the wood under the barrel) with the left hand, placing your index finger down the groove (flutes) of the forend. This will help you point at the target with this finger. If you have small hands, you may find it more comfortable to have your index finger on the bottom of the forend. Gripping the forend wood closer to the trigger allows a faster swing. Moving the hand further out will slow the swing down. There are different opinions about how tight to hold the forend. Hold reasonably firm, but not at the “white knuckle grip”. A death grip tightens your muscles too much and does not allow a free swing.

The right hand should grip the gun much like you are shaking hands. The joint at the base of the thumb should be near the midline but not over the top of the grip. Again, hold the gun reasonably tight and use the right

hand to move the gun to the target. Your face should be on the “comb” (the top part of the stock where your face rests) close to your right hand, about one inch from your nose to your thumb. If your thumb bumps your nose, you are too close. Keep your face firmly on the comb when moving to the target and while making the shot.

When mounting the gun, bring the gun to the face first, and then pull the gun into the shoulder. Keep the gun pulled in fairly snug for two reasons. One, it helps with recoil, getting a push rather than a bump, and two; it keeps the gun from moving around.

Keep your weight forward. A “good rule of thumb” is to have your nose over your left great toe. This helps in your swing, gun control, and keeps you from looping your gun barrel on angle targets. Keeping your weight forward with a small forward flexion at the waist also takes pressure off your low back, again, reducing felt recoil.

Stance is also important. Set the feet up to take the hard angle target on each station. Start on post one with the right foot a little further back from the front of the walk than the left. As you proceed from post one to post five, the right foot is moved slightly further back on

each station. At post five, the feet are essentially perpendicular to the front walk.

Some of these instructions may be a little hard to grasp at first, but with experience, they will seem to be second nature.
